

Fleckenstein Castle

An impregnable fortress that overlooks the Northern Vosges like a ghost ship perched at an altitude of 358 m, the fortified castle of Fleckenstein is undoubtedly the most emblematic of the ten fortified castles that lie dormant in the forests of Alsace Verte. Built in the 12th century on an impressive rocky outcrop, it was destroyed without a fight by the armies of Louis XIV in 1680. It is now a very popular site for visitors. For budding knights, the Château des Défis® offers a medieval adventure in the castle and in the forest.

The Treetop Trail Alsace

New for 2021, the Chemin des Cimes Alsace will gradually take you above the treetops, to the top of the 29-metre panoramic tower. Among the highest points in the area, it offers a 360° panorama of the Northern Vosges, the Rhine plain and the Black Forest. Discovery stations along the way and a 75-meter slide inside the tower will make your experience even more fun!

The fortified city of Wissembourg

Referenced among the Most Beautiful Detours in France, on the Route des Châteaux, the fortified city of Wissembourg is a small tourist town full of charm that is indeed worth a visit. It has developed over the centuries around the Benedictine abbey on the banks of the Lauter River and has had a prosperous but also tumultuous past, as evidenced by its remarkable built heritage: the church of Saints-Pierre-et-Paul, the Salt House, the Town Hall, the Stanislas Palace, the Bruch district, the ramparts...

The Pretzel Factory

La <u>Fabrique à Pretzels</u> has a visit area of more than 5,000 m² where you will discover the history of the Pretzel, this famous Alsatian aperitif biscuit. You will also be able to observe all the stages of their production, from the preparation of the dough to the bags of ready-to-eat <u>Boehli</u> brand pretzels, <u>without</u> forgetting their tasting at the end of the journey at the Pretzel-Bar! The Pretzel will no longer hold any secrets for you!

The fort of Schoenenbourg and the work of the Lime Kiln

The Schoenenbourg fort in Hunspach and the Lime Kiln in Lembach are two sites of the Maginot Line; this defensive line located about ten kilometers from the German border which it was supposed to protect during the Second World War. A visit to these concrete giants, 30 metres underground, will immerse you in the daily life of the soldiers.

The Great Wintersberg and hiking

The highest point in the Northern Vosges at 581 metres above sea level, the Grand Wintersberg is a very popular place for walkers and hikers. It is also an emblematic place for the development of hiking in the Vosges Mountains. This is evidenced by its 25-metre panoramic tower built between 1889 and 1890 by the Club Vosgien, whose many volunteers have been marking and maintaining the hiking trails since the end of the 19th century.

The Rural House of the Outre-Forêt

An old farmhouse, typical of this corner of Alsace, the Maison Rurale de l'Outre-Forêt is now a heritage interpretation centre dedicated to Alsatian popular arts and traditions. Throughout the year, according to the seasons, it allows you to learn more about the habitat, the way of life, the traditions and the know-how in the Alsatian countryside between 1920 and 1950.

The French Petroleum Museum

Alsace contains oil in its subsoil and it was not in Texas or Saudi Arabia, but in Pechelbronn, in the 18th century, that the first oil exploitation site in the world was opened, making the Pechelbronn region the cradle of the oil industry. The French Petroleum Museum traces 500 years of oil history in Northern Alsace; from the use of this oil at the end of the Middle Ages to the closure of the refinery in 1970.

The spa resorts of Morsbronn-les-Bains and Niederbronn-les-Bains

Alsace Verte is a destination resolutely focused on well-being. It is fortunate to have two spa resorts, those of Morsbronn-les-Bains and Niederbronn-les-Bains, the only spa resorts in Alsace. There are also several spas and other addresses dedicated to well-being, and above all a natural environment conducive to relaxation and rejuvenation with the Northern Vosges Regional Nature Park, classified as a World Biosphere Reserve.

The Cleebourg vineyard

Along with the Wissembourg vineyard, the Cleebourg vineyard is the gateway to the Alsace Wine Route. It extends over 200 hectares of south- and south-west-facing hillsides in the communes of Cleebourg, Rott, Oberhoffen-lès-Wissembourg, Steinseltz and Riedseltz, and benefits from 10 exceptional "lieux-dit" terroirs. The seven Alsatian grape varieties are refined, vinified and blended <u>at the Cave de Cleebourg,</u> a cooperative winery that brings together the productions of more than 150 winegrowers.

Betschdorf pottery

The village of Betschdorf, one of the two pottery villages in Alsace, still has several potters who perpetuate this ancestral know-how that is the technique of salt stoneware, a particular process introduced to Betschdorf at the beginning of the 18th century by potters from the Westerwald (Rhineland-Palatinate). The utilitarian and decorative pottery from Betschdorf produced in their workshops is recognizable by its gray color and cobalt blue patterns.

The White Villages

These traditional villages, typical of this part of northern Alsace, have managed to retain their authenticity. They are called "white villages" in reference to their white half-timbered houses. And how can we mention them without mentioning Hunspach, labelled Most Beautiful Villages in France and elected Favourite Village of the French 2020! A few minutes away are those of Seebach, Hoffen, Hohwiller A little further on, Betschdorf, Schleithal, Kutzenhausen, Birlenbach.

Fleckenstein Castle

Large castle in ruins (12th, 17th century) that belonged to the Barons of Fleckenstein. Carved into the rock.



The fortified city of Wissembourg

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Located in the far north of Alsace on the immediate border with Germany, Wissembourg, a town on the border with Germany, is a gateway to the Northern Vosges Regional Nature Park.

Originally, the foundation of the Abbey of Saint Peter and Saint Paul

Wissembourg was born from the foundation of **the abbey of Saint Peter and Saint Paul** on an island in the Lauter in 660, which over the centuries became the most important in Alsace. The construction of the Romanesque church, of which only a bell tower and belfry remains, dates from the 11th century and has earned the town a place to be listed as an essential stop on **the Romanesque Route of Alsace**. Altenstadt, a municipality associated with Wissembourg since 1974, is home to another jewel of Romanesque art: **the church of Saint Ulrich**, which also dates from the 11th century and which, due to the simplicity and robustness of its lines, remains a magnificent example of this religious art.

From the 12th century and throughout the Middle Ages, the town grew rapidly around the abbey which was equipped with a defensive wall and an imposing tower called Schartenturm. The city of Lauter, formerly ruled by the abbots, gradually freed itself from their tutelage and enjoyed great prosperity over the following centuries. A new urban enclosure was erected to protect the city and its suburbs, giving new boundaries to the city, going far beyond the primitive walls of the abbey.











From the end of the 15th century, the Wissembourgeois suffered from successive wars and looting by brigands, the best known of whom was Hans von Trotha, Lord Palatine who terrorized them. **Hans Trapp,** the legendary character of Alsatian Christmas so dreaded by children, is a reincarnation of this frightening man of war who was rampant in Wissembourg and its region at the time.

This fortified town is an essential stop on **the Romanesque Route of Alsace**, as well as the Route of the Castles and Fortified Cities of Alsace.

A proliferation of labels for the municipality

A former fortified town, Wissembourg is now the gateway to the Route of the Castles and Fortified Cities of Alsace. The perfectly preserved remains of the ramparts that protected the city and its inhabitants during these troubled times, can be seen during a splendid walk in the green belt of Wissembourg. They form a composite ensemble that has been remodelled over the centuries and has been protected as an additional Historic Monument since 1933.

Since 2009, Wissembourg has also been a member of the " **100** Plus Beaux Détours de France " **network**, a label awarded to small French towns for their beauty and charm.

Wissembourg has managed to preserve a remarkable architectural heritage over the centuries, a witness to a rich past and perfectly highlighted today.







The must-sees of the Cité

Among the must-sees, **the Maison du Sel**, **a** former bourgeois hospital whose construction dates back to 1448, impresses with its proportions. **The Bruch district**, **a** former marsh that is home to some beautiful buildings including **the Maison de l'Ami Fritz** (16th century) located on the banks of the Lauter, is full of charm. Not far away, don't miss **the church of Saint Jean** and its North German-inspired organ, built by the Belgian manufacturer Thomas and inaugurated in 2015.

Don't hesitate to enter <u>the abbey church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul</u> to discover the cloister and the Romanesque chapel which houses a reproduction **of Christ of Wissembourg** (ca. 1060), the oldest known intact figurative stained glass window in the world.

Just a stone's throw away, <u>the Stanislas Palace</u> made available to the Polish king in exile whose daughter Marie Leszczynska married Louis XV on August 15, 1725. Finally, push open the door of <u>the Tithe Barn</u>, this former wheat market whose façade served as the enclosure of the abbey enclosure and which now houses the Tourist Office of Green Alsace.

Lime kiln structure - Maginot Line

Lembach



Take to the skies by visiting this structure which dominates the village. A striking return to the past, immersion guaranteed!

Guardian of the Sauer valley, the Lime Kiln structure is located on a hill overlooking the village of Lembach. It bears the name of an old lime kiln.

The 3 km of galleries go 30 m underground. 24 officers and 600 men lived there. They belonged to a fortress infantry regiment. They were mobilized several times before returning to their posts at the end of August 1939. As there was no action between September 39 and May 40, they organized themselves, seized the cattle that were wandering in the streets of Lembach whose population had been evacuated... Visitors will learn about their living conditions by visiting the dormitories, toilets, kitchens and infirmary.

The structure was the target of the Stukas from June 1940. Lacking an effective anti-aircraft defence, it nevertheless resisted and held out for another five days after the armistice which took effect on 26 June. After special negotiations at Wiesbaden, the troops were forced to surrender but left with the honours of war on 2 July.

The Germans then occupied the fort, stripping it of everything they could use on the Atlantic Wall. The tests of overpressure gases caused considerable damage.

The layout is similar to that of the other forts, except that the men's entrance being located 24m higher than that of the ammunition, the fort has an inclined plane allowing the transport of equipment and ammunition from the ammunition entrance to the upper gallery. Enjoy your visit, walking shoes and warm clothing (13°).

THE STAGES OF THE JOURNEY

Start: town hall square





The start is at the town hall square. Heading west following the . At the exit of the village, take the direction of Disteldorf.

Disteldorf ____





The path, still marked, crosses the private forest of La Verrerie. Coming out onto a clearing is the Disteldorf. Continue on the road to the Hohwardt Pass. The landscapes are very varied, in terms of vegetation, levels and escarpments. The trail climbs up to Disteldorf.

Hohwardt Pass



The Hohwardt Pass is a large crossroads. Turn left onto the forest road, signposted from the , im a slow descent. Be careful, after about 1.2 km, a path takes over from the forest track, to the left and downhill.

Route D 3



Stay on this path until you reach the D 3. Cross this road, continue to the right (see photo), pass the fishing ponds on the left, take the direction of the Froensbourg ruins.

5 Ruins of Froensbourg



Take north of the ruins of Froensbourg. The path is still marked from . At the foot of the ruin, turn right, towards the east, still on the . At the bottom of the valley, follow the blue rectangle to the Fleckenstein pond.

6 Ruschedamm



Walk along the Fleckenstein pond. At the end, the Ruschedamm, turn right, cross the bridge, cross the D 925, enter the forest, turn right, following the . Head south, pass the pond now on the right to reach the pond car park.

At the Fleckenstein pond car park, turn left below. Cross the road up to the Gimbelhof, climb the stairs while following the .

From the campsite in Fleckenstein to Lembach



After starting the climb in front of the entrance to the campsite, you have about 2.5 km left following the road to the village. Once you arrive at the entrance to the village, turn right onto the Bitche road to reach the starting point at the town hall.

A multitude of rocks and castle ruins as far as Obersteinbach.








THE STAGES OF THE JOURNEY

1 From the car park to the Lower Silesian monument

The trail quickly takes you to the two monuments to the soldiers of Lower Silesia: a tall yellow sandstone column and a pink sandstone rock topped with an eagle. Continue on the same markings, passing in front of a beautiful panorama of Woerth and its bell towers.

From the monument of the soldiers of Lower Silesia to the house of the Turks


Continue your path of remembrance in Alsace by entering the forest. You pass again in front of a monument in memory of soldiers who died during the battle, but this time the graves are French. The route then joins a wide forest road and heads north.

3 From the Turcos' house to the car park

Pass by the remains of the "Maison des Turcos", the former home of the rural warden of Woerth. The route of this trail of remembrance in Alsace then descends quietly to your starting point by taking a path between forests and orchards.









Niederbronn-les-Bains, a small town nestled at the bottom of the Falkensteinerbach valley, is known for its thermal baths, its casino, its parks, its flowers and its activities throughout the year.

The commune paid a heavy human and patrimonial price during the wars.

But there is still a little-known Niederbronn, made up of small streets around the city centre, and plunging us back into the history of this endearing city. This circuit invites you to take a walk on the heights, all around the city, away from the main roads.

Let yourself be seduced by the views of the surrounding forests and hills, the view of the emblematic Wasenbourg castle and the view of the city nestled along the river in the hollow of the valley.

Duration of the route: 1h - 4km. **Departure**: at the bottom of the Grunelius passage, near the station.


